


Smaller local government bodies in Wales Annual Return for the Year Ended 31 March 2016





On the basis of their review of the Annual Return and supporting information, they report whether any matters that come to their attention give cause for concern that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have not been met.

I certify that we have completed the audit of the Annual Return for the year ended 31 March 2016 of:

Cyngor Tref Machynlleth Town Council

External auditor's report

I am required by law to satisfy myself that:

- the council's accounts are prepared in accordance with the Accounts and Audit (Wales) Regulations 2014;
- the accounts comply with all other statutory provisions applicable to the accounts;
- proper practices have been observed in compiling the accounts; and
- that the council has made proper arrangements for securing economy efficiency and effectiveness in its use of resources.

The Council failed to maintain proper accounting records as required by Regulation 6 or the Accounts and Audit (Wales) Regulations 2014. The accounting statements for the financial year ended 31 March 2016 are not supported by records provided by the council and there are discrepancies that the Council has been unable to explain. Consequently, I am unable to conclude on whether or not the accounting statements in section 1 of the 2015-16 annual return:

- properly presents the Council's income and expenditure for the year and its financial position as at 31 March 2016;
- complies with all statutory provisions related to the accounts; and
- has been compiled in accordance with proper practices.

In its Annual Governance Statement, the Council states that has approved its accounting statements as prescribed by law (assertion 1). The law required this approval to take place by 30 June 2016. On the basis of my audit, I conclude that this statement is incorrect as the council did not approve the accounts until 3 May 2017.

Other matters and recommendations

I draw attention to the following recommendations made under section 25 of the Public Audit (Wales) Act 2004. These recommendations were considered by the Council at its meeting on 2nd July 2018:

- 1. The Council must ensure that it sets up a website as soon as possible to enable it to comply with the requirements of the Local Government (Democracy)(Wales) Act 2013.
- 2. The Council must ensure that it identifies which documents it is required to publish electronically and makes appropriate arrangements to post these on its website promptly.
