All council energy contracts have been reviewed. (**Atodiad A**). The contracts currently within their renewal window are low usage and are under the threshold at which utility companies will offer a "green" tariff. Council has delegated to the Clerk authority to agree a contract and that will be done within a fortnight.

The boiler at the Plas is increasingly inefficient and is now regularly breaking down. Quotes have been obtained to replace with much more efficient boilers, the price of a new heating plant will be in the £40,000-£50,000 range. The Clerk and Facilities Manager have been exploring possible grant funding to carry out this work and have received confirmation of a grant of £4,000 from Bro Ddyfi Community Renewables. A larger application to the lottery is in the process of being prepared. In their confirmation letter (Atodiad B), Bro Ddyfi Community Renewables specifically mentioned that they were excited that we were considering installation of PVs.

Details of our current electricity contracts have been passed to Jon Andrews of Smart Energy Systems so that he can update the financial viability calculation / business case for PV installation. Once that report is received it will be placed before the Climate Action Panel.

The Bio Diversity Policy submitted by this Panel was adopted by Full Council without amendment.

The Rugby club have removed a hedge on grounds they lease from the Town Council, the Town Council had no recourse as landlord to prevent this action but urged Powys through the planning system to issue a hedgerow retention notice. Powys declined to do so.

The Rugby club have since committed to replacing the hedge and have asked for input from the Town Council on its location and composition. Following discussions with Fern Towers of Gerddi Bro Ddyfi the Clerk recommended to Council that her suggestions form the basis of our response. Those recommendations have now been passed to the rugby club. (See Atodiad A,B,C)

Work has only just begun on the Bee friendly Towns application, it is hoped that we Panel members can look over the criteria (**Atodiad Ch**) before the meeting and provide relevant information to help the Clerk complete the application.

Hi Dewi,

I've attached a picture with a red squiggle on it, representing where it would be ideal to have a hedge. Although only small, the two patches of woodland at either side support loads of wildlife - we counted lots of bats in them during the BioBlitz. So having a hedge to connect these woodlands would act as a brilliant wildlife corridor, encouraging creatures to travel between them and forage along them, therefore extending their habitat range.

As for species, a mixed hedge would be good, filled with species that can be easily layed, as this will prolong the hedge's life and keep it a manageable size for the club. I'm sure our volunteers would love to help with such work in future (though they probably wont need to do this for 7 years or so!).

Handily, I went to a hedge laying course on the weekend, which informed me of the best species for laying. These include: hawthorn, elm, hazel, oak, field maple, holly.


Apparently Maria at the Forestry Hub has loads of trees that need planting asap, so they might be worth getting in touch with. I don't have a contact myself but will

Plant up roundabouts

Create patches of pollinator-friendly flowers in front of signage such as on roundabouts and by town welcome signs

Create a Bee Friendly School

Encourage wildlife spaces and educational bee-themed activities and workshops

Make a Bee Friendly Station

Install floral planters on railway station platforms

Put up homes for wildlife

Give nature a home by positioning bug hotels and bird boxes around the town

Share seeds
