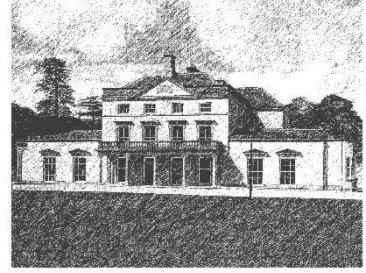

Machynlleth's lantern procession is really special. It brings us all together and has so many benefits to so many in the Dyfi Valley.

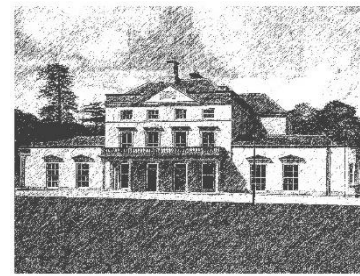
We would like to come to a Town Council Meeting and talk about the new team and hopefully get Town Council support for the plan.

MINUTES OF THE ORDINARY MEETING OF MACHYNLLETH TOWN COUNCIL on Monday 29th June 2026 at 6.30pm in the Vane Tempest room at the Plas

PRESENT:

Cllr J. Paige (Chair of the meeting), Cllr A. MacGarry, Cllr K. Bryan, Cllr J. Honeybill, Cllr N. McCarten, Cllr R. Hughes, Cllr A. Evans, Cllr P. Jones.

ALSO IN ATTENDANCE: Nicole Beaumont (Clerk) and Catrin Willetts (Minutes taker).
2 members of the public (1 online).

1. **ATTENDANCE AND APOLOGIES:** See lists above.

2. **DECLARATION of INTERESTS:** Cllr A. Evans declared an interest in item 12.1.

3. **PUBLIC PARTICIPATION:** A last-minute speaker, Ruth Jenkins, presented an idea to council of a circular walk inside the parkland to start and end at the Plas gates on Maengwyn Street. She described wanting an accessible, inspirational walk that could be used for park runs. Funding opportunities could be sought through sports and culture grants.

4. MAYOR'S REPORT:

Cllr Paige attended the CIC Hen Stablau meeting on the 25th June. They are planning to reconstitute the structure of the CIC, with a hope of bringing more people in without the pressure of having to be an official committee member.

5. MINUTES OF LAST MEETING:

5.1: Minutes of the Annual Meeting (AGM) held on 18th May 2026 were agreed. **Unanimous.**

5.2: Minutes of the ordinary Full Council meeting held on 18th May 2026 were agreed. **Unanimous.**

5.3: Notes from the Climate Panel meeting held on 11th June 2026 were noted and that the climate panel has an application form for the Bee Friendly Town scheme.

6. MOTIONS/MATTERS ARISING:

6.1: As 13.6 in the minutes of the Full Ordinary meeting 18th May 2026 the clerk is yet to write a letter

7: COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT:

7.1: On June 17th Cllr Evans attended a scrutiny meeting related to all leisure centres throughout Powys. There is to be £6 million invested in the next 4 years, in addition to £1.6 million already allocated. The extra £6 million will only cover essential backlog maintenance.

There is a planned road closure in Forge scheduled for 3 months duration, starting in August. This is for essential works by Hafren Dyfrdwy/Severn Trent. The clerk is to write a letter of concern for residents that will be affected.

Cllr Evans passed on residents concerns that the grass is not being cut at Bryn Y Gog where the children play and at a patch where fruit trees are growing. Cllr McCarten explained the grass was a misunderstanding and was already being dealt with. She will look into the patch where the fruit trees are.

8: PLANNING:

8.1: P/26/0272/FUL – Support. **Unanimous.**

9: FINANCE:

9.1: Councillors agreed to pay the invoices as per list presented. **Unanimous.**

It was agreed that other scaffolding quotes should be sought as there is no timeline in place yet as to how long the scaffolding will remain at both sites.

9.2: It was agreed to accept quote 3 for insurance from Clear Group. **Unanimous.**

9.3: The Internal Auditors report for FY2025-2026 was approved. **Unanimous.**

It will be discussed further at the Finance meeting on 13th July 2026.

10. REPORTS from NOMINATED REPRESENTATIVES on OUTSIDE BODIES:

10.1: Minutes of the latest Patients Forum meeting were presented to Councillors.

10.2: Cllr McCarten reported the latest correspondence regarding the lack of day centre provision in Machynlleth.

10.3: Surgery data included for information purposes.

11: Clerk's Report:

11.1: Councillors noted that the request for the erection of an art installation by Heledd Wyn did not sit on MTC's land but to Powys County Council. Clerk to write an email advising her to seek permission from them.

11.2: It was decided that the request from Louise Halestrap for a community led project should be offered a site for the project to be built. Councillors agreed to a site on the grass, facing the sports fields. **Unanimous.**

11.3: Councillors accepted the PiPIF grant award. **Unanimous.** and agreed to the working groups proposed. **Unanimous.**

11.4: A new set of Standing Orders were approved. **Unanimous.**

11.5: The new allotment leases were approved and will be sent in April 2027 when leases are renewed. **Unanimous.**

11.6: Councillors agreed to the proposed training plan. **Unanimous.**

11.7: Cllr MacGarry attended an online meeting organised by Hywel Dda on the Bronglais stroke unit consultation. She was surprised that only 3 people attended to voice the community's concerns. The next consultation is in the Plas Hall on 30/06/2026 from 2pm and a further public consultation by Hywel Dda University Health Board on the future of local stroke services, runs until July 26th 2026.

11.8: Council were presented with correspondence from Chris Higgins (Gardd Lledfair project) stating that he is to withdraw his application and re-submit with the advised changes and comments he received from various consultees.

11.9.1: Quotes for required works to trees in the park were considered. Councillors decided to go with quote 1 for tomography investigation on 1 oak tree . **Unanimous.** For all other works quote 3 was chosen. **Unanimous.**

12: Members items:

12.1: Cllr Hughes presented a request from Aeron Pughe to ask for free use of the Plas Hall to host Gwyl Y Plas, in order to raise funds for the national Eisteddfod in 2027 along with other local charities. It is to be a Country and Western event, held on 24th October 2026, with a view to make it an annual event. Councillors agreed to waive the hall hire fee. **Majority.**

12.2: The proprietor at 33 Maengwyn Street has been spoken to by a councillor regarding the issue of barrels causing an obstruction on the public pavement. It is being looked into and new furniture is being sought. It was decided that any noise complaints would be a licencing issue to direct at Powys County Council.

12.3: The bike racks by the Public Toilets that were causing an obstruction for disabled members of the public have already been removed.

12.4: Cllr MacGarry informed Councillors she was unable to attend the One Voice Wales conference.

13: Correspondence:

13.1: The clerk presented a letter that was sent to Ascona on behalf of MTC with reference to lighting on their forecourt. No response yet.

13.2: Council were presented with email correspondence concerning the Fflecsi bus service provision and have been offered for an officer to attend an MTC meeting to discuss. Clerk to accept the offer.

13.3: Councillors were presented with an invite of engagement to discuss and review the community risk register.

13.4: Councillors were presented with a response from Strategic Road Network Correspondence Team in relation to the Heol y Ddall pedestrian crossing, informing them that they will inspect it and carry out any necessary works.

13.5: Extra matter discussed :

Councillors agreed to waive the hire charge for gazebos hired by Balchder Pride due to a misunderstanding which resulted in their bunting being removed before the date agreed. **Unanimous.**

5.1 : An inspection by the Food & Hygiene Dpt at Powys County Council was carried out on 4/6/2026. As yet the report from PCC has not arrived. The new Café supervisor - Gareth Vince (who started on 1/7/2026) will chase up.

5.2 : The Plas allotment garden will be taking part in the National Garden Scheme (NGS) during 2027 which will be the NGS centenary year. The site will be open to the public at dates to be confirmed and all monies raised will go towards nursing, caring and cancer charities.

MTC will be paying for the removal of the wasps nests that were by the pergola and pond area of the allotment. This area is the sheltered gathering place for all the allotment plot holders.

5.3 : The Chair of the panel has asked for more information with regards to the Energy report recently undertaken which gives the Plas a C rating on the EPC scale and is valid until 2036.

5.4 : A Legionella risk assessment for the Plas building was carried out on 30/6/2026.

An assessment was also carried out at the Public Toilets by Maengwyn carpark, Facilities Manager is waiting for both reports.

5.5 : 2 additional push open pads were recommended for installation at the new Hall doors. These items will be considered when setting up the budget during the autumn.

5.6 : The trampoline matting at the Playground needs to be entirely replaced. Tenders/quotes will be sent for. Also a broken bin within the enclosure will be replaced.

5.7 : A maintenance contract was set up to service the 2 new doors and all the payment facilities at the public toilets near Maengwyn carpark. At the '24h' cubicle a non warranty item call out for repairs was made to replace the latch system on the door.

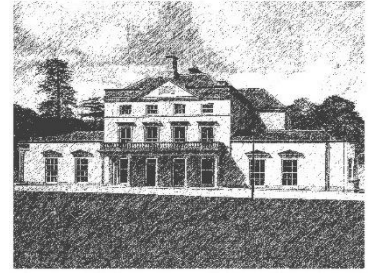

On average some 25 to 30 stalls are regularly present. Other markets in the county do not have such a presence with some markets hardly operating at all.

Gydag wythnos yn unig ar ôl i ymateb i'r ymgynghoriad ar wasanaethau strôc, mae Bwrdd Iechyd Prifysgol Hywel Dda yn annog pobl ar draws Sir Gaerfyrddin, Ceredigion, Sir Benfro ac ardaloedd cyfagos i rannu eu barn. Bydd yr ymgynghoriad wyth wythnos, a lansiwyd ar 28 Mai 2026, yn cau ddydd Sul 26 Gorffennaf 2026.

Mae'r Bwrdd Iechyd yn gwahodd cleifion, gofawyr, staff, cymunedau lleol a rhanddeiliaid nad ydynt wedi cymryd rhan eto, i lenwi'r holiadur neu gysylltu â ni i rannu eu barn.

Mae'r ymgynghoriad yn ceisio adborth ar opsiwn a ffefrir ar gyfer dyfodol gwasanaethau strôc ledled Hywel Dda, a ddatblygwyd yn dilyn ymgysylltiad helaeth yn ystod cam cyntaf yr ymgynghoriad yn 2025 fel rhan o'r Cynllun Gwasanaethau Clinigol.

Ar hyn o bryd, darperir gwasanaethau strôc ym mhob un o'r pedwar prif ysbyty yn Hywel Dda – Bronglais, Glangwili, Tywysog Philip a Llwynhelyg. Fodd bynnag, nid yw gwasanaethau yn bodloni safonau clinigol cenedlaethol yn gyson ac nid oes staffio strôc arbenigol ar gael 24 awr y dydd, saith diwrnod yr wythnos.

Mae'r opsiwn a ffefrir y mae'r Bwrdd Iechyd yn ceisio barn arno yn cynnwys:

- Uned strôc aciwt ac adsefydlu 24 awr yn Ysbyty Glangwili

With only a week left to respond to the consultation on stroke services, Hywel Dda University Health Board is encouraging people across Carmarthenshire, Ceredigion, Pembrokeshire and neighbouring areas to share their views.

The eight-week consultation, which launched on 28 May 2026, will close on Sunday 26 July 2026.

The Health Board is inviting patients, carers, staff, local communities and stakeholders who have not yet taken part, to complete the questionnaire or get in touch to share their views.

The consultation seeks feedback on a preferred option for the future of stroke services across Hywel Dda, developed following extensive engagement during the first phase of consultation in 2025 as part of the Clinical Services Plan.

Currently, stroke services are provided across all four main hospitals in Hywel Dda – Bronglais, Glangwili, Prince Philip and Withybush. However, services do not consistently meet national clinical standards and there is no specialist stroke cover available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

The preferred option that the Health Board is seeking views on includes:

- A 24-hour acute stroke and rehabilitation unit at Glangwili Hospital
- A stroke rehabilitation unit at Bronglais Hospital

- Uned adsefydlu strôc yn Ysbyty Bronglais

Ers lansio'r ail gam hwn o'r ymgynghoriad ar 28 Mai 2026, mae mwy na 2000 o bobl wedi cymryd rhan drwy fynychu digwyddiadau a chyfarfodydd, wyneb yn wyneb ac ar-lein, neu drwy lenwi'r holiadur ymgynghori.

Dywedodd Mark Henwood, Cyfarwyddwr Meddygol Gweithredol Bwrdd Iechyd Prifysgol Hywel Dda: "Diolch i bawb sydd wedi cymryd yr amser i rannu eu barn gyda ni hyd yn hyn. Rydym wedi clywed ystod eang o safbwyntiau ac mae pob cyfraniad yn ein helpu i ddeall yn well beth sydd fwyaf pwysig i'r bobl rydyn ni'n eu gwasanaethu.

"Gydag wythnos ar ôl cyn diwedd yr ymgynghoriad, rwy'n annog unrhyw un sydd heb gymryd rhan eto i wneud hynny nawr. Dyma'ch cyfle i helpu i lunio dyfodol gwasanaethau strôc yn ein hardal.

"Rydyn ni'n gwybod pa mor ddinistriol y gall effeithiau strôc fod i gleifion a'u teuluoedd. Ein nod yw darparu gwasanaethau diogel a chynaliadwy sy'n rhoi'r cyfle gorau posib i bobl wella trwy fynediad amserol at ofal strôc arbenigol.

"Nid oes unrhyw benderfyniadau wedi'u gwneud. Bydd yr adborth a gawn drwy'r ymgynghoriad hwn yn chwarae rhan hanfodol wrth lywio'r penderfyniad terfynol yn ddiweddarach eleni."

Bydd yr holl adborth a ddaw i law yn ystod y cam hwn o'r ymgynghoriad, ynghyd â safbwyntiau a gasglwyd yn ystod 2025 a'r dystiolaeth glinigol ddiweddaraf, yn cael eu hystyried yn ofalus cyn gwneud penderfyniad terfynol.

Since the launch of this second phase of consultation on 28 May 2026, more than 2000 people have participated by attending events and meetings, both in person and online, or by completing the consultation questionnaire.

Mark Henwood, Hywel Dda University Health Board's Executive Medical Director, said: "Thank you to everyone who has taken the time to share their views with us so far. We have heard a wide range of viewpoints and perspectives, and every contribution is helping us better understand what matters most to the people we serve.

"With a week left before the end of the consultation, I encourage anyone who has not yet taken part to do so now. This is your opportunity to help shape the future of stroke services in our area.

"We know how devastating the effects of a stroke can be for patients and their families. Our aim is to provide safe, sustainable services that give people the best possible chance of recovery through timely access to specialist stroke care.

"No decisions have been made. The feedback we receive through this consultation will play a vital role in informing the final decision later this year."

All feedback received during this phase of consultation, alongside views gathered during 2025 and the latest clinical evidence, will be carefully considered before a final decision is made.

Following a discussion with Jeremy he suggested I reach out to you with our plans to improve the current pump track in Machynlleth.

As you are aware I'm sure, Machynlleth and the Dyfi Valley is becoming a "destination" for the biking world. This was started decades ago with locals manually digging tracks around the area for their own enjoyment, these tracks have today become famous around the UK. We now have the best Mountain bike park in the UK and possibly Europe built by the World Champion Atherton family bringing hundreds of visitors per week to the area and lifting the Valleys profile across the Globe.

Dan Atherton next project is to build cross country rides in the area which will bring another style of rider to the area. Machynlleth is now also becoming a very popular destination for road and gravel riders with new routes starting and ending in Machynlleth.

I personally recently opened a new Bike shop in Machynlleth with a detailed business plan after running very successful business in the past. The interest from visitors was expected but what has surprised me is the interest from local adults and children.

It's so satisfying to see so many children on bikes and not sat in front of a screen.

I have already pulled together with local businesses to see if we could improve the current pump track that is in need of a refresh and expansion.

I have already asked for approval from Machynlleth Football club in their recent AGM to extend the current pump track onto some unused land they have with no cost to them.

Our next step is to seek approval from the town council.

Funding will be raised and managed by a committee of volunteers from local businesses to parents of children.

The benefits of the improvements will be seen by both locals and visitors to the area. It will also bring more visitors to the town which benefits everyone.

We are in the process of producing plans that we are happy to share with you and the community.

I thank you for your email and the notice for the works to be done at Forge.

Machynlleth Town Council has had sight of the works concerning the mains water infrastructure starting in July and finishing in October.

Councillors were appreciative of the enormous enterprise, at the same time are very much concerned of the great inconvenience caused to the people living in that area. People who shop, some who work and some who will need the doctor and the pharmacy in Machynlleth.

Whilst you have created a rolling programme of staged closures to mitigate disruption, this work is still causing significant disruption and worries to the residents.

Councillors are asking for more reassurance that between you at Hafren Dyfrdwy and the residents affected, better communication will be implemented. Hafren Dyfrdwy and Severn Trent are both huge organisations, often the message between them and their contractors seems to take a long route via various departments before it reaches the affected residents and quite often not in its original intended form.

Residents should not be forced to take very lengthy detours to get to work and more importantly to reach their doctors and the pharmacy in Machynlleth, nor should carers who will need to visit some of the residents in Forge.

Also tourist enterprises will be very much affected by these works at the height of their busiest time of the year, will they get fair compensation for hindrance to their business ?

From the notice you issued, they have your name and phone number to call on you and that you will guarantee to be accessible for any complaints they may have. This notice has been widely publicised on our social platforms.

Councillors and residents alike, want your assurance that everyone is considered, dealt with sympathetically and accommodated to the very best of your ability.

I have had sight of the proposed works for Forge and Machynlleth to replace mains water pipes between July and October. I appreciate that it is an enormous infrastructure project and that you have created a rolling programme of staged closures to mitigate disruption.

Nevertheless, significant disruption will be inevitable and I am asking for extra reassurance about the communication routes between you and the residents. In my role as Clerk, I have years of experience of trying to communicate with Hafren Dyfrdwy and Severn Trent and it has not been good. They are both huge organisations and the relationship between them and all thier associated contractors is unfathomable to the layman and enquiries seem to take labyrinthine routes around departments, get duplicated, re-interpreted and generally lost.

You have clearly put your name and number on the attached document which I will publicise through various community channels - can you guarantee that you will be easily accessible and that residents need not be forced to try other routes? So often, I see situations escalate into unmanageable acrimony for want of better communications.

There is no doubt that ordinary residents, farmers, businesses and tourist enterprises will be massively affected. Suppliers, deliveries, visitors, parent and carers, emergency services and

everyone just trying to get to work or simply go shopping will all struggle. Please may I have extra reassurance that they will be considered, dealt with sympathetically and accommodated to the very best of your ability?

I think a meeting would be a great idea. It would be really valuable to get everyone around the table Powys County Council, the Town Council, local groups, and residents, to have an open conversation about how we manage our green spaces in a way that balances biodiversity, public safety, accessibility and people's different expectations of what our shared spaces should look like.

From the Town Council's perspective, I think there are a number of positive things we could explore together, including:

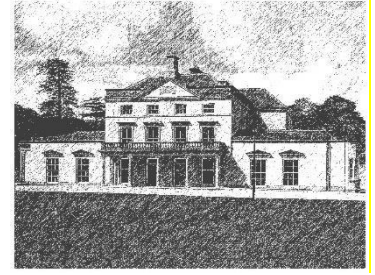
- Developing clearer principles for managing different types of green spaces – identifying which areas should be kept tidy and which are managed primarily for nature.
- Improving communication so residents understand why certain areas are left to grow or are managed differently throughout the year.
- Looking at opportunities for increased community involvement, such as verge or green space adoption schemes, volunteer days, or "Verge Guardians" as you've suggested.
- Working with partners to reduce unnecessary herbicide use where possible and ensure maintenance practices align with biodiversity commitments.
- Sharing management plans, timelines and coordinating better between the different organisations responsible for land across the town to avoid conflicting approaches.

I know there is a huge amount of passion for Machynlleth's green spaces, and that's something we should build on rather than allow to become divisive. If we can bring people together and have an honest discussion about the challenges and opportunities, I'm confident we can find a more joined-up approach.

I'd be very happy to attend a meeting and help support that conversation. Thank you for offering to organise it.

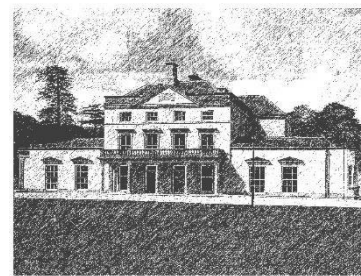

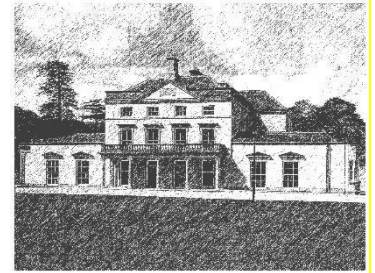
The guided walk led by Dr Adam Coward was another highlight, bringing Lady Londonderry's story to life through visits to places connected with her lasting influence on the town.

Subject: Update on work to improve relationship between county, town and community councils

Dear Nicole

I'm writing to update you about the work to improve communication and engagement by the county council with town and community councils, so that a more productive and mutually satisfying relationship between our two levels of local government can be built.

You will recall that I met with a number of town and community councils between November last year and March this year. I wrote a report setting out the common themes and the range of suggestions that emerged through those conversations and have been involved in several meetings with the leader of the council, Cllr Jake Berriman, and with senior officers, to discuss the findings. There is considerable openness and willingness in the county council leadership to engage better with town and community councils, build relationship, consider suggestions, learn from your experience and work together more effectively. The outcome of the meetings, and the next steps now being planned, are as follows:

- Cllr Berriman will write to all 110 town and community councils in Powys, setting out how the county council plans to begin this process of improving the relationship between us and finding a way to share information and share our respective insights and experience that works for all concerned.
- The in-person Sustainable Powys meetings will be stood down, in recognition of their not meeting the needs of many, especially smaller and more rural, councils.
- In their place:
 - More face-to-face direct engagement between the county council, town and community councils and communities themselves will take place throughout each year, on specific subjects relevant to communities - matters where up until now we would have consulted via online surveys only. Nineteen officers have recently been trained in effective engagement and co-production approaches, and these officers will approach town and community councils directly as part of their work.
 - Regular online meetings between the county council and town and community councils will be restored. These will be led by the Cabinet, supported by officers, as they used to be. Town and community councils will be invited to share with us the subjects they wish to discuss or receive information about in these meetings. We hope that online meetings will be more accessible to small and rural councils, and that collaborative agendas will enable you to share your insights, experiences and ideas as you did with me when I visited you, and work with councillors and officers to bring about the changes you wish to see locally, understand better why some changes can't be made and have the opportunity to explore alternative courses of action.

- The link officer role will be retained. It will complement the role of the county councillor. Town and community councils will be asked to use the online Report function for all issues that can be dealt with in that way. For more complex issues or ideas, you will be asked first to approach your county councillor for support. The link officer is your resource for any matters that the county councillor is unable to resolve or progress. The link officer will also support the county councillor in resolving technical matters that the county councillor is unable to resolve without expert input.

The list of link officers has changed slightly recently, and I have not yet been sent the updated list, so I cannot confirm your link officer today, but I'm on holiday for two weeks from tomorrow and don't want to delay sending you this update until I return. I will have received the updated list by the time I return and I'll send you the name and contact details of your link officer then. You may also have received the email from Cllr Jake by then.

Thank you very much for your engagement in this process to date, and your patience with it. There is openness and willingness across our organisations, and I hope that together, by trial and error, we can make this work.

Dear Clerk and Town Councillors

I'm writing to ask both clerk and town councillors to take part in Closing The Gap, a small project I'm involved in, exploring people's views on the generation of electricity via large-scale wind parks in rural Wales.

Your participation can be as brief as you wish it to be, if you don't have much time.

We're exploring where common ground might be found between people with different opinions and experiences about this subject.

We use an interactive online survey. It's different from the usual kind of survey – much more engaging and interesting. It's easy and simple. It's anonymous; the only personal information it asks is whether you live in Powys or Ceredigion. You can do as little or as much of it as suits you. You can go in once, for a few minutes, and finish, or you can go in and out as often as you wish between now and the end of September, when it closes.

The survey consists of a series of statements. You click Agree, Disagree or Pass/Unsure. You can add statements of your own, for other participants to respond to.

The survey is open to anyone who lives in Powys, and we want to hear from people from right across the spectrum of opinion on this issue.

I know that town councillors are usually asked to represent the people in their community and that the value of their input is often framed around their deep understanding of local issues. However, I am inviting them to say what they think personally, and to participate as themselves, as individual residents of Powys.

I would be very grateful if you would take part in the survey, however briefly. I would also be grateful if you would all share this with anyone you know who might be interested too.

What is the purpose of this project?

To explore and identify common ground on the topic of wind energy in rural areas of Wales. If people with widely different opinions about wind energy in rural Wales can find common ground, we as communities may be able to reduce the divisive polarisation that we see the issue causing, and work together to navigate the challenges we face.

How will we find common ground?

We will use a well-established platform called Polis. It has been used around the world. In Taiwan, for example, Uber's arrival sparked anger and controversy. Polis was used to create a consensus policy that welcomed Uber's benefits while protecting workers' rights.

What will happen to the results?

We will compile a report setting out how the project worked and its findings. This will include detail of where common ground exists. We will then explore how that common ground might provide a foundation for people working together, bringing their combined expertise, experience and ideas to bear on finding solutions and moving forward.

We will share the report with Planning Inspectorate Wales, with the companies involved in wind energy projects, with Growing Mid Wales and with local planning authorities.

Who are we?

Who is funding us?

We have a small grant from social justice non-profit, the Andrew Wainwright Trust.

What's the timescale?

The Polis survey will run until September. We'll then analyse the results and compile the report.

We will be finished by the end of 2026.

How do I take part?

You will see a statement, with options below it to Agree, Disagree or Pass/Unsure.

Below those, you will see a box in which you can enter a statement of your own.

You don't have to submit a statement; you can complete the survey without doing so if you wish.

If you do submit a statement, it has to be standalone. For example, you can't say 'I disagree with the statement above, it's wrong.' But you can create a new statement, setting out your different perspective on the last statement. For example, if the last statement was 'Solar farms and water turbines should be prioritised over windfarms', you can't say: 'No, they shouldn't'; but you can say something like (if this is your opinion): 'Wind turbines should be prioritised over other forms of renewable energy'; and you can say why; for example: 'Wind turbines should be prioritised because XYZ'.

Each time you select Agree, Disagree or Pass/Unsure, the next statement appears.

The box below in which you can add a statement always remains there, and you can add as many statements as you wish.

Once you have written your statement, select 'Submit'. Your statement will be added to the total number of statements which other participants will see.

The box will return to a blank box, ready for your next statement.

New statements will be added by other participants, so the survey will grow and develop over time. You may wish only to respond to the statements available on the one occasion you go in; or you may wish to come back in multiple times, to respond to new statements and add further new ones of your own.

The survey will recognise you next time you go into it, so you can leave and come back as many times as you wish.

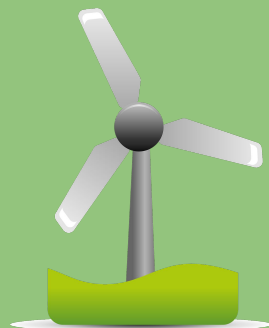

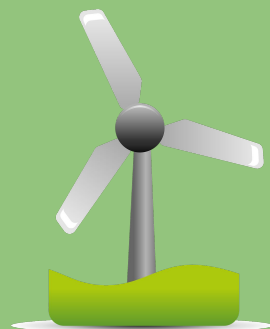
